Highland Park: A Film Friendly City:

The City of Highland Park is pleased to announce its new film friendly policy. This policy is reflective of the City's support and welcoming of film productions in the great State of Michigan. We welcome your production and developed this policy as a means to make your filming process as seamless as possible.

This policy offers you a process that has:

- ✓ No red tape
- ✓ Easy access to the decision makers
- ✓ A clear and precise process

We look forward to working with and supporting you as you prepare to produce your next film in the Historic city of Highland Park, Michigan.

Highland Park: A Unique & Historic City:

The City of Highland Park has a myriad of unique, historic & modern features to offer that will make your next film a "state of the arts" production.

The City of Highland Park is the "Birth Place of Mass Production". It was in the early 1900s when Henry Ford chose this community to build his Model-T factory. Built on the east side of Woodward Avenue, the Ford plant marked the early emergence of the moving assembly line making Highland Park the "***Birthplace of Mass Production***". Ford produced millions of Model-T cars in Highland Park, attracting tens of thousands of immigrants to Highland Park for the unprecedented \$5-a-day wage and a chance to enter the growing middle class.

This historic emergence created a City with a unique stock of historic design reflected in the residential, commercial and public properties throughout the City. The continuing evolution of the City now contains a wide range of setting to serve your filming needs - for any era, environment or storyline – Highland Park is your place!

Highland Park: An Easy Access City

The City of Highland Park (HP) requires a film permit for all work being filmed within the City boundaries (public or private). To obtain a HP Permit, the film company must complete an **“Application for Filming”** and submit it to the Department of Community & Economic Development **at least 3 weeks prior to filming.**

Based upon your filming needs, other approvals and services may be required and applicable fees will apply:

1. **Filming Permit:** Required for ANY film productions in HP.
2. **HP Police Service:** Required any use of public right-of-way and/or street closure (Hourly rates apply for support; see rates sheet)
3. **HP Fire Department:** Required for any use of combustibles and the like. (Hourly rates apply for support; see rates sheet)
4. **HP Public Facilities Agreement:** For use of any Municipal buildings and property. (rental fees varies by property; see rates sheet)
5. **Other Municipal Services:** E.g. Fire Hydrant Permit; Property Ownership inquiries etc. Fees vary; We will coordinate with you and the appropriate department to service your need(s).


